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Clue 1: Gellatly Nut Farm Regional Park

2375 Whitworth Rd

Over 100 years old, this historic farm was worked by Jack, David Jr and David Gellatly. Jack & David Jr. developed 36 nut varieties, while David was known as the "Tomato King" and "Potato King."

TASK: Take the 1st letter from the Tomato King's first name.

Clue 2: Gellatly Landing | 4200 Gellatly Rd

Look for the bench commemorating the 2003 Okanagan Mountain Park Fire to locate the park sign.

TASK: Take the 1st letter of the 2nd word on this sign.

Clue 3: West Kelowna Yacht Club | 4111 Gellatly Rd

Did you know that the clubhouse is a former car ferry that carried 30 cars and 150 passengers from 1939 to 1956.

TASK: Find the clubhouse sign. Take the 3rd letter from the 1st word.

Clue 4: Rotary Trails | Gellatly Rd

This small park has a bridge that crosses over Powers Creek, which has a total stream length of 29.5 km. It supports kokanee salmon and rainbow trout populations.

TASK: What type of salmon lives here? Take the 3rd letter of its name.

Clue 5: Willow Beach | 4055 Gellatly Rd

This beach was named for the iconic trees that once lined this shoreline, the name remained even after the aging trees were removed.

TASK: Take the 2nd letter of the tree type in the beach's name.

Clue 6: CNR Wharf | 4030 Gellatly Rd

Built in the 1930s as a freight dock for local produce, barge shipping ended in 1972 before a full restoration in 2014.

TASK: At the wharf end, take the 3rd letter of the 2nd word etched on the sign.

Clue 7: Gellatly Dog Beach | 3911 Gellatly Rd

Nearby Smith Creek flows down from McDougall Rim and Mount Swite before entering Okanagan Lake.

TASK: Which mountain does the creek come from? Take the last letter of its second word.
